

2023 Collins Writing Contest

Rules and Regulations

- By submitting an entry, authors confirm that they have read and understand the full contest rules and regulations available online at www.gppl.ca and at the Children's Information Desk at GPPL.
- 2. Authors must live in the City of Grande Prairie, the County of Grande Prairie, or the MD of Greenview.
- 3. Authors may submit only one entry per year, 2000 words or fewer.
- 4. Judges must be able to read the stories easily.
 - a. Entries must be typed (not handwritten) and double-spaced, with a minimum 12-point font size.
 - b. Entries may not use custom fonts.
 - c. Stories must be written in English.
- 5. Entries must be able to be accurately reproduced in the print anthology.
 - a. Authors must retain a digital copy identical to the submitted entry.
 - b. Entries may not use custom fonts.
 - c. Stories may not refer to external material (websites, songs, etc.)
 - d. Stories may not include illustrations.
 - e. Authors must submit stories as .doc/.docx, .odt, .rtf if selected as a winner.
 - f. Authors may not edit their story after submission; the story printed in the anthology must be identical to the story as read by the judges.
- 6. Entries must represent a single author's storytelling.
 - a. Authors are encouraged to use a spellchecker.
 - b. Parents and friends may assist with typing, answer questions regarding spelling and grammar, or assist by reading sections aloud to dyslexic authors, but the process must be author-directed.
 - c. Authors cannot work in teams, nor workshop stories online.
- 7. Entries must be unique and publishable with no legal impediments.
 - a. Stories must be original content with original characters.
 - b. Authors may not submit fanfiction.

- c. Stories must be fiction, not a simple retelling of something that happened in real life.
- d. Stories must be previously unpublished.
- e. Stories may not be posted online.
- f. Stories may not be self-published.
- g. Story titles must be unique and not the same as the contest theme
- 8. Stories must be able to be judged fairly.
 - a. Authors cannot put their names on their stories.
 - b. Authors cannot name characters after themselves, friends, or family members in any way that might identify the story's author.
 - c. Judges may not judge a category a friend or family member has submitted a story for.
- 9. This year's entry deadline is Tuesday, February 28, 2023, at 8:00 pm.
 - a. Entries submitted after this point will not be accepted for judging.
- 10. GPPL staff members will notify contest winners by phone starting Friday, April 7, 2023. Please do not contact GPPL to ask if you have won.
